# The Season of Advent

Advent is the season that begins the Liturgical Year. It originated in the early Church as a short period of intense preparation for the celebration of the nativity of the Lord on December 25th. Advent slowly came to be structured into four Sundays with proper readings and prayers. This season is marked by devout and joyful expectation as we recall the first humble coming of the Lord at Bethlehem. At the same time, we are invited to direct our mind and heart towards Christ's final coming in glory at the end of time. This is well expressed both in the Scripture readings, in the prayers as well as in the two parts into which Advent is divided. During the first part of Advent, from the beginning until the 16th December, the focus of the liturgy is on the second coming of the Lord, while during the second part, from the 17th to 24th December, the emphasis is on the immediate preparation for Christmas.

At the beginning of the new Liturgical Year, we join the people of Israel who longed for the coming of the Messiah with great expectancy. By listening to the message of the prophets foretelling the birth of the Saviour, we are renewed in our desire to see him at his glorious coming at the end of time as our Lord and universal Judge. The two 'comings' of the Lord are connected by the daily coming of the Lord in our life through his Word, Sacraments, other people and events. Recalling the ways in which the people of Israel prepared themselves to welcome the Lord must throw light on the ways in which we make ready to welcome the Lord today, as he comes to us. Our welcoming of the Lord in our daily life is the best way for us to prepare for his coming in glory at the end of time.
