### Feast of the Presentation of the Lord

Every 2<sup>nd</sup> of February is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. Forty days after the celebration of Christmas, in accordance with the Jewish tradition, the Church remembers the presentation of the newborn Jesus to the Temple. Joseph and Mary make the journey from Bethlehem to Jerusalem in order to fulfil the Law. There in the Temple they meet Simeon and Anna, the representatives of those who were looking forward to the coming of the Messiah. These two holy Isrealites recognise in the infant Jesus the Saviour and light of all nations. Traditionally on this day candles are blessed and carried in procession before Mass as a symbol of Jesus who is the light of all nations.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> day of February is the feast of St Blaise. During Mass we shall use candles to bless the throats of the faithful asking for deliverance from all diseases of the throat.

# **Preparation for Sacraments**

Last week we met with the parents of the pupils who this year will be eligible for the sacraments of **First Reconciliation** (24<sup>th</sup> March) and **First Holy Communion** (10<sup>th</sup> May). We emphasised the role of the parents in the preparation process to be complemented by the school and the parish. On the part of the parish we insist as a minimum criteria that the children put up attendance at Mass on weekends and join the Children's Liturgy Group where special themes will be treated with them. It will be very inappropriate to administer the sacraments to anyone who only shows up on the d-day. The children will therefore receive the Parish attendance cards to be marked each Sunday by the priest. Grandparents and.... neighbours can help to bring the kids to church when their parents are unable to do so.
