The Eighteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time

This week continues to be rich in liturgical feast days. **Monday** is the feast of the Dedication of the **Basilica of St Mary Major** in Rome. Built by Pope Sixtus III after the Council of Ephesus (431) is the principal Church of Our Lady under the title of Mother of God (Theotokos in Greek). It is one of the four major basilicas in Rome situated on the Esquiline Hill. Like the other basilicas the Church is very beautiful and ornate.

Tuesday is the feast of the **Transfiguration of the Lord** a feast which marks the start of the novena in preparation for the **Solemnity of the Assumption** on August 15th. Novena prayer will last for nine days and will take place before Mass beside the altar of Our Lady.

Thursday sees the feast of **St Dominic** founder of the Order of Preachers, the Dominicans founded to counteract the Albigensian Heresy.

Friday sees the feast of **Sr Teresa Benedicta of the Cross** whose name was Edith Stein murdered on 9th August 1942 at Auschwitz.

Saturday is the feast of **St Lawrence** who was a deacon and martyr. His name is mentioned in Eucharistic Prayer One (the Roman Canon).

In our catechesis last week we asked the question, 'is it still possible to produce saints from our families?' Have you heard of **Joe Wilson** a local lad attending Taylor High who died on the 20th December 2010? This rather extraordinary boy has had a collection of his thoughts published. There are devotions celebrated at the Grotto in his name. The next is on **19th August** at the **Grotto** at 7.30 pm. See the notice board and look at joesfaith.com Having read the thoughts from his diary there is definitely something of the **Little Way of Therese** in them.

FOURTH CATECHESIS ABOUT ST THERESE.

The life of the Church is enriched with the example of its saints. Occasionally the Church encourages the Faithful to follow the spirituality of particular saints none more so than St Therese of the Child Jesus whose simple approach to a rich spiritual life is called the Little Way. Therese tells us that from an early age she hoped to become a saint. She thought there was not enough about her to perform staggering acts of heroism or wisdom or even holiness. How wrong she was in this analysis. However, she became convinced that it was possible to become a saint by performing the ordinary things of life in an extraordinary fashion. We call it The Little Way. She would take small steps like a child takes with a parent placing herself confidently in the merciful arms of a loving God with whom she fostered a close personal relationship. The ordinary blessings of life which can so often be forgotten would be opportunities to offer the Lord thanks: a beautiful day, a visit from the children, the blessing of a good meal, the support of friends met in the street, the opportunity to receive Holy Communion. These and a thousand other opportunities were avenues of thanksgiving and Grace. There would also be innumerable opportunities to perform small acts of kindness which might be little and unobserved but which were performed for the love of God. Then there were the small self sacrifices which Therese was so particular about. She would sit beside the nuns in the Convent whom she did not particularly take to. She would be pleasant to the Sisters who were not always pleasant or affirmative towards her. Such daily experiences may have run against her inclinations but became opportunities to spread the love of God and make the small world in which she lived become a better place. The spiritual approach known as The Little Way of Therese is suggested to each of us as a means of achieving sainthood. By performing the ordinary things of life for the love of God, they become extraordinary and we live by the Little Way. As far as Therese was concerned this was how amazing grace was released into the world and the love of Jesus given to everyone. It would seem that the opportunity to become a saint is there for us. We may not become martyrs or brilliant theologians or spiritual icons but we can achieve holiness through The Little Way. Begin the practice this week in preparation for the events at the end of this month. It is our patron saint who invites us to do this.
