For many years Christian communities have taken the opportunity to use late September and early October to celebrate **Harvest Thanksgiving**. In an age when there is so much food and drink readily available it it easy to simply take them for granted. The ability to offer Thanks and to do so often is to possess a virtue of unprecedented quality. So many people in the world have very little to live on. In an age when we are becoming so aware of the plight of the environment and our need to protect it, the opportunity to celebrate **Harvest Thanksgiving** is even more important. We shall celebrate **Harvest Thanksgiving** next **Sunday**, **October 13th** at 10.00 am Mass. On Sunday October 20th we will celebrate **Mission Sunday** and on Sunday October 27th we will celebrate another **Mass of Thanksgiving** offering the Lord thanks for the blessings of the visit of St Teresa and offering Him thanks for the gift of Catholic schools to our people. May these schools continue to flourish and be staffed by teachers who are committed to the service of God and His people.

On November 4th a new priest will be joining the parish of St Teresa. He is Fr Bernadine a Nigerian priest currently studying in Rome. Fr Bernadine is no stranger to Scotland. He supplied in Chapelhall during the summer. Bishop Toal asks the parish to welcome the new priest and help him settle in as much as possible. He wishes the whole parish the gift of generous hearts and sends everyone blessings, thanks and good wishes in preparation for the 60th anniversary of the celebration of the first Mass in St Teresa's Church.
