# The Fifth Sunday of Lent

This Fifth Sunday in Lent marks the start of what used to be called Passiontide. In fact before the liturgical revision in the 1960s this Sunday was called the First Sunday in Passiontide. The second Sunday in Passiontide is next week, Palm Sunday, a celebration which marks the start of Holy Week. On this fifth Sunday many parishes cover their statues and crucifixes with purple a colour which dominates the Church until the glorious whites of the Easter Vigil. We will become more aware of a sense of darkness engulfing Jesus. In more recent years a sense of darkness has affected the life of our Church. The evangelists are aware of Satan returning at the 'appointed time' to cripple Jesus. Could it be that Satan has managed to undermine the credibility and confidence of the Church through the scandals? As parishioners of St Teresa's let us use these final weeks of the Lenten season and the **Triduum** to pray for the Church and all God's people who may feel terribly affected by it all. The Resurrection of Jesus reminds us that he is with us always until the end of time. We will trust in him.

Next weekend we will celebrate **Palm Sunday**. On Saturday evening Mass will be at the usual time of 4.30 pm with the simple blessing of palms. **The passion of St Luke will be read**. On Sunday morning we will begin our liturgy at 09.45 am in the hall with the solemn blessing and procession of palms (weather permitting). The passion of Luke will also be read. As in previous years parishioners are invited to sit throughout the reading of the passion and enter into the mystery of the death of Jesus our Lord. Every encouragement is given to parishioners to attend the **Easter Triduum**. Notice the times: **Holy Thursday Chrism Mass at 11.30 am**. **Thursday of the Lord's Supper at 7.00 pm**. **Good Friday at 3.00 pm**. **Holy Saturday at the tomb of Christ (Easter Vigil) at 8.30pm**. Each of these liturgies has a beauty all of its own. Is there something about Holy Thursday which touches people in particular our Ministers of the Eucharist?

We are indebted to the **great men and women** from this village who built up, encouraged and fostered all that is wonderful about the parish of St Teresa's. Devoted to the Lord and his Church these people might be described as '**Legends**' and in spite of their gentle humility, these people are legends to whom we owe so much. Isaac Newton spoke about 'standing on the shoulders of giants'. On **Thursday 11th April** we shall celebrate the **90th birthday** of of **Joseph Collins** a fantastic person, a member of the **St Vincent de Paul Society for 76 years**. We wish him every birthday blessing and good wish. Who will be 91 years old on April 24th?

# Stations of the Cross
