As we know, the Assisted Suicide (Scotland) Bill was published during Holy Week by Liam McArthur MSP and put before the Scotlish Parliament.

The Catholic Parliamentary Office in Scotland have now made available an online resource to support public engagement with the process of parliamentary scrutiny. #### **Euthanasia, Assisted Suicide: What You Need to Know**

Thank you to the parishioners who attended the talk last Tuesday, 7<sup>th</sup> May. The talk titled Euthanasia, Assisted Suicide: What You Need to Know was given by Dr. Gordon MacDonald, CEO of Care Not Killing - <a href="https://www.carenotkilling.org.uk">https://www.carenotkilling.org.uk</a>. The talk was very informative including the confirmation of the devaluing of human life that would result if the Bill became law including for those people, currently aged 16 years and over, who are vulnerable including those affected by disability, who are elderly, sick or depressed. The Bill also has implications for palliative care services such as those provided by St Andrew's Hospice. Also, very concerning for health and social care professionals is the removal of conscientious objection. We must pray and get in touch with our MSPs to express the view that this Bill should not become law here in Scotland – see information above from The Catholic Parliamentary Office in Scotland. It really is frightening what is proposed in this Bill and also very importantly what it could lead to as has happened with law like this throughout the world.
