The Diocese has asked for a **collection** this weekend to support the training of our young Seminarians which currently costs £25,000 per year.

Fr Bergin apologises that no Rosary will be prayed before evening Mass this Saturday. He is preaching at Carfin and hopes to be back in good time for the evening Mass. However, we hope that those who usually attend will pray the Rosary privately and offer it up for our seminarians. Let us **remember Fr Francis** from Carfin who underwent a bit of a health scare following the visit of the Relics of St Teresa to the Grotto. One suspects that excessive tiredness had something to do with it. Fr Francis will be out of circulation for a while.

The **relics of St Therese of the Child Jesus** will be leaving Scotland on the 19th September following a visit to Barlinnie prison. For the outpouring of Faith and the many graces received **we give thanks to God.**

The parish is deeply indebted to one of our parishioners who works incredibly hard to maintain the garden at the front of the Church. The beauty of the garden is so often commented about. However, not for the first time cars have driven over the growing area surrounding the statue of Saint Teresa. Roses have been squashed, concrete keeping the small paving slabs in place have been damaged, the hard work ruined. Such a pity. One suspects this is the result of cars manoeuvring to get out of the car park. We have two huge car parks with lots of space. The front of the church receives a disproportionate number of parked cars. Would an ambulance of a fire engine be able to access the property with ease? Next week the parish will undergo a Health and Safety Inspection. It is possible the latter question will be asked.

The **Piety Stall** continues to stock and excellent selection of cards, reading materials and other items suitable for cultivating our spirituality. What an **excellent attendance** of children last week for morning Mass. Every encouragement is given to bring our children and allow them to attend **Children's Liturgy**. Every encouragement continues to be given to families to attend Mass when Sacraments are being requested from the Church. Priests become just a little despondent when families discontinue any attendance after the celebration of Sacraments. We have to ask what is the purpose of Sacramental preparation and what will a growing lack of attendance mean for the existence of our parish community in the years to come. Grandparents can be an enormous source of help here. So often they undertake the task of bringing children to Mass. **This is a blessing.**

Our **current age** has grown to accept abortion as an acceptable practice. The number of these 'procedures' being carried out in the United Kingdom is staggering. Our national birth rate is running rate an all time low. There are a number of organisations who actively encourage the practice. As Christian people the practice of abortion is completely against our tradition. Life is sacred from womb to tomb. However, words alone are insufficient. That is where the work of the Innocents comes in. The Innocents function within our Diocese and seek to provide practical help, confidential counselling and pregnancy testing. This Saturday is the feast of the Triumph of the Holy Cross. After Mass there will be Veneration of the Holy Cross similar to that carried out on Good Friday during the sacred liturgy. A number of beautiful feast days are about to be celebrated including the feast of St Teresa on October 01st. However, keep in mind that the celebration of Midnight Mass this Christmas will mark the 60th anniversary of the first Mass celebrated in this Church.
